

# CONIFERS PRIMARY SCHOOL

Dear Parents/Carers

I struggle to think where September went. It has been an exciting blur of new faces, new challenges, new initiatives, new staff and new parents. All of whom I would like to warmly welcome to the Conifers' community.

Our reception children have settled into Conifers extremely quickly and all others have taken to their new timetable and teachers very well indeed. Just a little reminder for you at home what that timetable includes; the teaching of Maths and English during the first two hours of the morning, all pupils participating in reading every day, cursive handwriting being taught across the school, a focus on teaching mental arithmetic skills, opportunities to practice extended writing skills every half term and whole school or Year group assemblies at the end of the day on a Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

As a school, Conifers strive to provide the best environment, best teaching and best learning opportunities for your children and your feedback around this is both welcomed and listened to. You can have a natter with me on the school gate each morning or at the end of the school day, or you can use our website. The feature for this is the 'Parent View' option, which can be found at the bottom of our Homepage. This link will navigate you to Ofsted's 'Parent View Homepage' where you are invited to comment on the school using the 'Give your views now' icon. Your views are important to us as a school, and we will use these to help us improve our provision. I would hasten to add that positive views are just as welcome as ones offering areas for development.

Talking of development, we have introduced a new reward system this term based around the use of Class Dojo. Being somewhat 'long in the tooth' you would probably get a better idea of what they are and how they work by talking to your children, who, hopefully, have already mentioned them to you, however, this much I do know. Children in the school will be rewarded with Dojo Points for everything they do that has a positive impact on themselves, their peers or the school. The Dojo will replace the House Points - but as a school, we are still keeping the Houses, more on that shortly. When a child has collected a certain number of Dojos, they can trade them in for a reward of their choosing. The children have helped us decide on what these rewards will be, but panic not, we have scrutinised some of them to ensure that as parents, do not suddenly become the proud owner of a Komodo Dragon! Children who constantly follow the school ethos and remain on their green cards (representing good behaviour and obviously full school attendance) all day, will also be awarded a Dojo on a daily basis. At the end of every half term, these children will be automatically rewarded with something like an extended break or lunch or the opportunity to 'come off' the timetable and watch a film with their peers to thank them.

So now back to the House System. Each half term, we will hold an event or 'House Day' where the children in each House - Dragon, Pegasus, Gryphon and Phoenix will compete against each other in various activities such



as sport, art, puzzle solving or, as in our first House Day, Bridge Building. Each House will choose the best bridge built by their team and 'pit it' against the other Houses. The bridges, (all of which will be built using the same materials) will be tested to see which one holds the most weight and will win the House Cup, which will be awarded for that half term.

I am extremely excited that our Year 6 children have already had the opportunity to experience some serious 'learning outside the classroom' this term. Our week-long residential to Dartmoor, staying at the River Dart Country Park, was an enormous success. I was lucky enough to be 'let out' for the week and joined everyone in caving, climbing, kayaking and balancing my way through the High Ropes course, to name but a few of the activities. As a school, this residential will now become part of our annual Year 6 calendar and we look forward to offering this magnificent opportunity for many years to come.

I would like to formally welcome four new members of staff to Conifers who have already started to make a very positive contribution to the children and the school. We have, in order of Year groups; Miss Curtis, Miss Blake, Miss Jones and Miss Samuel. As with all things in nature, there is always a balance to be found, so whilst welcoming new staff, we also have to say farewell to others. Mr Kirby, who worked with children in our Thrive base and on a 1:1 basis with children in the classroom, has left to focus on a career in social work and care. Whilst Mrs Burgess, our school receptionist, has 'hung up the phone' on her years of supporting you as parents, the children and the school staff, for a quieter life on a desert island somewhere in the Indian Ocean. Admittedly, that may just be wishful thinking, particularly as her time will now be spent helping her daughter, who is expecting her first baby in the new year. We wish them both and of course Mr Kirby, the very best with their future endeavours and thank them for their hard work and commitment to the school.

On the 'housekeeping' front, I hope you'll agree that the enhanced fencing height has certainly improved the safety of your children whilst on the premises and the restriction of Budmouth pupils walking through the school at the end of the day has decreased unnecessary footfall. The restriction on parking at the start and end of the school day has also improved safety and allowed a greater freedom of movement. If I could direct parents to the notice in this newsletter regarding general parking, we could, collectively, improve safety even further.
